Later, he transferred to "E" Company, serving as a Platoon Commander, then being selected as the Company XO. He returned to active duty for 7 months, serving at MCB Quantico.

Being promoted to Captain, he joined COMM Company, H&S BN, 4th FSSG, Greensboro, NC in 1975. He served in various billets, Platoon Commander, OPSO, and ultimately, selected as CO from October 1979 – 1981. He was promoted to Major & served as OIC of numerous comms detachments.
